


# Bitterroot CASA Annual Report 2022-23

Bitterroot CASA, Inc supports the well-being of children and families in the child welfare system by addressing the circumstances that led to the removal and placement of a child in the foster care system. We advocate for the reunification of families, to establish safe, nurturing, and permanent homes, giving children the opportunity to thrive.

**We provided advocacy to 100%** of children removed from their homes in Ravalli County due to abuse and neglect in 2022 and 2023. Compared to 80% in 2021- 72% in 2020 and 35% in 2019.

Court Appointed Special Advocates **CASA** Volunteers served **3230 Hours** of service to children. They complete 30 hours of Pre-Service training and an additional 12 hours training annually. Their voluntary service provided **\$54,905 In-Kind Donation.**

**115 Children's found safe permanent homes 2015–2023. 50% were Reunified with Parents, 6% adopted by relatives, 27% were adopted by their foster parents, 8% have Guardianship with a relative, 2% have Guardians, and 7% Aged out of the system at age 18.**
